MINUTES

Chairman Licht asked for approval of the minutes of the Regular Board Meeting of October 23, 2003. Commissioner Sperry **motioned** to approve the minutes. Commissioner Granzella **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REQUEST OF THE BAY MEADOWS FOUNDATION TO DISTRIBUTE \$70,000 IN CHARITY RACE DAY PROCEEDS TO 25 BENEFICIARIES.

John Reagan, CHRB staff, said staff reviewed the request of the Bay Meadows Foundation (BMF) to distribute charity race day proceeds and found it in order. He stated staff recommended the Board approve the request. Jack Liebau of Bay Meadows Operating Company (BMOC) said his organization requested the proposed distribution be approved with the stipulation that BMOC have the right to direct the portion of the funds allocated to equine charities. Mr. Liebau stated after litigation, BMOC had the right to direct the amounts given to horse racing related charities. Commissioner Bianco **motioned** to approve the request of the BMF to distribute \$70,000 in charity

race day proceeds with the stipulation that BMOC direct the portion of the funds allocated to equine charities. Commissioner Sperry **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE APPLICATION FOR LICENSE RENEWAL TO CONDUCT ADVANCE DEPOSIT WAGERING (ADW) BY XPRESSBET.

Roy Minami, CHRB staff, said the application would renew XpressBet's license from January 24, 2004, through January 24, 2006. Mr. Minami stated staff had received a horsemen's agreement from Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF). Both agreements would be effective through December 25, 2004. Chairman Licht asked if XpressBet could describe its future television distribution. Ron Luniewski of XpressBet said his organization was currently on a number of cable systems throughout California. In the near future it would add Bakersfield, Santa Barbara and Sacramento to the list. Mr. Luniewski stated the additional cities would put XpressBet in 340,000 digital subscribers homes. XpressBet also had a fulltime salesperson in the California marketplace and would continue to get additional carriage on cable systems. Mr. Luniewski said XpressBet was still in discussions with a national satellite system. Mr. Luniewski stated XpressBet wished to amend its application to extend its license for one year versus two years. He said a one-year license would be more consistent with XpressBet's agreements with TOC and CARF, and it would bring XpressBet's expiration in line with the other ADW providers. Vice-Chairman Harris asked is cable subscribers had to pay an extra fee for

reception. Mr. Luniewski said he did not know which tier of service one had to receive, but the horse racing channels were not an extra cost. He stated if a fan subscribed to the Racing Television Network, they could receive the service on a disk for \$99 per month. Vice-Chairman Harris said he was concerned that some fans could receive the channels for free via cable television, while those with a dish had to pay. Mr. Luniewski said that was why XpressBet was seeking additional carriage. Chairman Licht asked if XpressBet had any data indicating it was creating new horse racing fans. Mr. Luniewski said the data indicated there was an increase in the frequency softer fans made wagers. Chairman Licht asked if more jobs had been created in California. Mr. Luniewski said the Horse Racing Television facilities at Santa Anita employed 27 persons, 12 of which were union employees. In addition, seven persons manned XpressBet booths. Commissioner Landsburg said the ADW providers needed to find a way to reach new fans. He stated such fans should not only use the ADW services, but should also want to go to the track. Commissioner Landsburg said he did not see any effort to find fans that would place ADW wagers and also go to the tracks. Commissioner Granzella **motioned** to approve the application by XpressBet for a period of one year. Vice-Chairman Harris **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REQUEST OF THE HOLLYWOOD PARK RACING CHARITIES, INC. TO DISTRIBUTE \$230,000 IN CHARITY RACE DAY PROCEEDS TO 25 BENEFICIARIES.

John Reagan, CHRB staff, said the amount to be distributed was actually \$235,500. He stated the amount indicated in the notice was an estimate, as the charitable organization meet after the notice of meeting was mailed. Mr. Reagan said staff found the request in order and recommended approval. Commissioner Bianco **motioned** to approve the request of Hollywood Park Racing Charities, Inc. to distribute \$235,500 in charity race day proceeds. Commissioner Landsburg **seconded** the motion, which was **unanimously carried**.

DISCUSSION ON THE USE OF SECURITY BARNES DURING RACE MEETINGS.

Chairman Licht said the item was placed on the agenda after numerous persons contacted him regarding alleged violations of racing rules. He stated it was clear the industry had a problem with the perception that alleged drug violations were taking place. Chairman Licht said he wanted to state for the record that he believed the Board's investigative staff did an outstanding job with their limited resources. He stated staff did their utmost to protect the industry. In addition, the Board's drug testing program was without peer. Chairman Licht said he would like the discussion regarding security barns to be constructive; not the type of finger-pointing that had occurred. The discussion would be on the record and those who testified should do so with facts, not rumor. Ed Halpern of California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT) thanked the Board for discussing the issue. He stated it was an important issue on the

backstretch, and with other sports discussing undetectable drugs and substances, it was appropriate the Board also look at the subject. Mr. Halpern said he could not say drug violations were occurring on the backstretch. He stated, however, that the CTT, the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and the racing associations – as well as the Board – had been looking at improving backstretch security for a number of years. Mr. Halpern said a number of trainers were going to present the Board with a petition for a security barn. He stated the petition indicated that those closest to the backstretch perceived a problem and it was time for the Board to engage in a more aggressive approach to both perception and a possible reality. Mr. Halpern said he understood money would be an issue, however, the industry was in a situation where the interests of its public – and its own reputation – needed protecting. The public needed to trust racing for it to be successful so the industry had no choice but to confront the issue. Chairman Licht asked if the CTT had a formal position. Mr. Halpern said the CTT board believed there were many things that should have been implemented over the last three years, or conducted to a greater degree than they have been. He stated the items included increased surveillance on the backside; unannounced visits immediately preceding a race – when some activity, theoretically, would most likely take place; more complete testing; more extensive use of security cameras; the use of security barns or security stalls; and finally, saving blood samples. Mr. Halpern said saving blood samples was probably as important as any other security measure because new drugs, for which there was no method of detection, were frequently appearing. He stated the industry needed to find a way to deal with new drugs. One way was to let

the industry know blood samples were retained, and if a new test revealed the use of previously undetectable drugs, the trainer would be punished. Chairman Licht asked if the CTT had any evidence illegal drugs were being administered on the backstretch. Mr. Halpern said he did not have any evidence of illegal drug use, but if one looked back over time one could see the use of certain substances nationally. Chairman Licht said he understood the concept, but what made the CTT think illegal drug use was contemporaneously occurring? Mr. Halpern said the CTT did not say illegal acts were taking place; it had no evidence they were. However, it was not beyond the realm of possibility that undetectable drugs were being administered. Mr. Halpern said other professional sports were currently involved in a situation where drugs were appearing that had not been tested for; what made horse racing think it was immune? Vice-Chairman Harris said the Board was testing. He stated the issue with professional baseball was steroids. Mr. Halpern said that was correct, however, there were other substances involved in baseball that were not steroids. Chairman Licht said he agreed a major problem with perception existed on the backstretch, and owners, trainers and fans needed to be satisfied the sport was clean. However, when individuals and groups within the industry claim there was rampant drug abuse, but offer no proof, it only exacerbated the problem. Mr. Halpern said the Board and the CTT were on the same side of the issue. He stated he did not believe it was important to demonstrate illegal drugs were actually being used; it was important to show that everything possible was being done to ensure they were not. Regarding the issue of a detention barn: Mr. Halpern said the CTT learned most trainers believe every other option should be tried

before such measures are initiated. Commissioner Landsburg said throughout the history of the issue he was not aware of one trainer who had come forward with accusations of another trainer indulging in illegal activities. He stated he respected trainers' need to participate in a sport free of illegal drugs, but the trainers also had to help the Board. If that were the case, the Board probably could work towards security barns. Commissioner Landsburg added, however, money was a problem. He stated the industry was already looking at paying a portion of trainers' workmen's compensation costs - now it was being told if it did not provide more security, there would be no racing. It would be helpful if there were an organized attempt to provide information regarding who might be using illegal drugs so the Board could focus on them. If such information proved to be only the result of someone's dislike of another at least the Board would be on-track in its effort to determine the veracity of such rumors. However, there had not been one legitimate report from any trainers. Vladimir Cerin, a licensed trainer stated he had been involved in horse racing for almost 30 years. He said he started training in harness. Mr. Cerin stated harness racing was destroyed in California because of the perception the races were fixed. Now the same thing was happening to the other breeds. Mr. Cerin said the perception was that either trainers were using illegal drugs, or they were not training properly, and the perception was being fueled by the media. Mr. Cerin said articles in trade publications claimed top trainers were using improper practices. Other trainers read the articles and start believing the good trainers are cheating. Leaving the perception out in the open, under a cloud of suspicion would be a mistake. Mr. Cerin stated the Board

should do all it could to demonstrate that superior trainers were using legitimate methods. Mr. Cerin said he talked to a number of trainers and none of them wanted a detention barn. He stated trainers did not want to move their horses into unfamiliar environments. A lot of trainers might have signed a petition in favor of instituting detention barns, but none really wanted them. Mr. Cerin said what trainers really wanted was more surveillance. Vice-Chairman Harris commended Mr. Cerin for his role in the issue. He stated the perception on the backstretch was that there was not a level playing field. Vice-Chairman Harris said he believed the Board's testing program was good and not much was escaping it, but the concern was not with testing; rather, it was with the four hours before a race in which a horse might be receiving something to improve its performance. Mr. Cerin said he agreed the Board's testing was good, and staff was working well with their resources, but when a newspaper analyzed the performance of a trainer with and without surveillance and there was a drastic drop in the performance of horses, one had to come to certain conclusions. Either there was illegal activity, or the trainer had legitimate practices he did not want to divulge. It would not be fair to make a trainer divulge legitimate practices – so if there were surveillance cameras in a certain number of stalls – only the Board would know. However, it would go a long way towards restoring integrity in racing if the tape of every winner on a given day was reviewed. Mr. Cerin said drug testing was wonderful, but tests for a new drug tended to come a couple years after the drug. He stated he did not believe anyone was cheating, but he would like to see the wagering public have the same confidence. Mr. Cerin stated he would like to see a detention

surveillance system in place as quickly as possible. Install surveillance in a few barns, try it for one or more races a day, and announce the races were monitored, and then see what the handle was. Drew Couto of TOC said his organization's board discussed the issue. Mr. Couto said TOC felt the issue was serious. The TOC board was unanimous in its support of the trainers and would like to see a surveillance detention program initiated within 60-days. To accomplish the task an ad-hoc committee consisting of representatives of the tracks, TOC, CTT and the Board - as well as any trainers who wished to participate. Mr. Couto said one of the TOC board members had employees who dealt strictly with security and surveillance cameras. The TOC member volunteered those employees to assist the committee in exploring ways of dealing with the issues raised by the trainers. Mr. Couto stated cost would be an issue, but the industry would find the money. Commissioner Landsburg said one of the suggestions heard by the Board involved four-stall videotaping surveillance. He said he thought the ad-hoc committee should go forward, but he also thought the Board should consider taking immediate action by directing the track to immediately install several systems. At least it would be a step in the right direction. Was there any reason video cameras could not be installed in five to ten barns? Mr. Couto said Commissioner Landsburg's suggestion had merit, but haste might not be the proper course. A bit of prudence in implementing surveillance might result in something more effective. Mr. Couto said 60-days was on the outside. If the ad-hoc committee could implement a program sooner, it would. Chairman Licht said he thought Mr. Couto was correct. He stated he would form an ad-hoc committee. He stated he wanted the committee to meet

as soon as possible with TOC's assistance. Commissioner Bianco said if there was suspicion regarding a trainer whose horse won a race, the blood sample could receive expanded testing. He stated he did not want to see emphasis placed on just one aspect of horse racing integrity. Sherwood Chillingworth of Oak Tree Racing Association (OTRA) said his organization had surveillance on every stall, for every rated race in its meeting. He stated one either had a detention barn, or one had additional security personnel and cameras. Mr. Chillingworth said that when OTRA increased its surveillance complaints of unfair advantage for some trainers was minimized. Dr. Ron Jensen, CHRB Equine Medical Director, said he had experience with detention barns. He stated there was a lot more to a security barn than security. Horses would need to be fed, groomed, and the stalls cleaned, so there would be a lot of personnel coming and going, and theoretically, any of those persons, at any point, could administer a prohibited substance to the horse. Dr. Jensen said, based on the discussion before the Board, perhaps the industry was moving away from the security barn, but he wanted the industry to know it was a huge undertaking. Dr. Jensen stated drug testing was not perfect and could be improved. The Board utilized two testing laboratories: Truesdale Laboratories, which had been in the equine drug testing business for at least 50 years, and the University of California Davis Maddy Laboratory, which was new, state-of-the-art, and very well-staffed. Dr. Jensen said both laboratories did an excellent job. Two years ago the National Thoroughbred Racing Association originated the super test. One thousand two hundred seventy two samples that had been declared negative were subjected to the most rigorous equine drug testing available. Of the samples tested,

98.7 percent were negative. Dr. Jensen stated he was sometimes a little disappointed that people in the industry feel drug testing was not done as well as it could be. He added the Maddy Laboratory was one of the two laboratories chosen to conduct the super test. California's samples were sent to Cornell University. Alan Horowitz of Capitol Racing said Breathalyzer testing for harness drivers was instituted over 22 years ago. About six years ago, the harness industry began a blood gas-testing program independent of the Board. Horses in every race participate in such testing. Mr. Horowitz stated that in September of 2003 a 24-hour detention barn with 40 stalls was instituted at Cal-Expo. He said the barn was patrolled by state fair police for the horses in the California Sires stakes and special events. The horses arrive at the barn at 5:00 p.m. the day before their race and are sequestered through the evening and the following day up to race time. The only time they leave the barn is to warm up on the track.

John Reagan, CHRB staff, said Oak Tree had a terrific meeting with outstanding numbers. He stated staff would wait to see how the numbers compared with the 2004 meeting.

ELECTION OF BOARD CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN.

Chairman Licht **nominated** Vice-Chairman Harris for the position of Chairman. Commissioner Bianco **seconded** the nomination, which was **unanimously carried**. Commissioner Licht **nominated** Commissioner Granzella for the position of Vice-Chairman. Commissioner Sperry **seconded** the nomination, which was **unanimously carried**.

REPORT FROM THE PARI-MUTUEL OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

Commissioner Landsburg said the Pari-Mutuel Operations (PMO) committee met on December 4, 2003. He stated the committee discussed a proposal to begin the regulatory process to require each racing association to submit a list of the advance deposit-wagering (ADW) providers who receive their signal. Commissioner Landsburg said the committee also discussed a proposal to adjust the scratch time for "also eligible" runners. He stated the committee heard a considerable amount of testimony from individuals who were concerned that leaving horses on the also eligible lists until the last moment would hurt out-of-state wagering. The PMO committee put the issue aside. Chairman Licht said it was his understanding that the racing community was opposed to compelling distribution of the signal to ADW providers. Commissioner Landsburg said there was a question regarding Thoroughbred Owners of California's (TOC) position on the issue. He stated the full Board needed to discuss the proposal. Drew Couto of TOC said his organization had not taken a position on the issue. Mr. Couto said the TOC thought the Board should explore the distinction between the ADW

signal and a right to wager, and if the right to wager was something that should be distributed among all ADWs – while protecting exclusive television images. Mr. Couto said the TOC would not consider exclusivity in 2004, and would look at the performance of the ADW providers from an economic standpoint. He stated he did not want to elaborate on TOC bargaining position, however, the ADW providers had been warned. Commissioner Landsburg said it was his understanding that the committee would move forward with a regulation. Chairman Licht said he understood there would be fuller discussion of the issue as opposed to initiating the regulatory process. He stated he would informally poll the Board. Commissioners Sperry and Granzella said they believed the Board should see a proposal for a regulation. Vice-Chairman Harris said he did not know if it would make a lot of difference with regards to a discussion of the issue, but it would be “ok” to have a starting point. Chairman Licht said it was clear some of the Commissioners wanted to have a regulation for discussion. Jack Liebau of Santa Anita said the Board should consider whether the ADW contracts constituted a property right. He stated the Board should also address whether that would constitute a taking for which there would have to be compensation. Chairman Licht said he had discussed the issue with Deputy Attorney General Derry Knight. He believed there were other matters that should be considered as well, however, the Board would look at a rule and discuss the issues at a future meeting.

Issue: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE TO CONDUCT A HORSE RACING MEETING OF BAY MEADOWS OPERATING COMPANY, LLC AT BAY MEADOWS APRIL 7, 2004 THROUGH JUNE 20, 2004.

Bay Meadows Operating Company, LLC filed its application to conduct a thoroughbred horse racing meeting at Bay Meadows:

- April 7 through June 20, 2004, or 55 days, the same as 2003. The association proposes to race a total of 473 races, or 8.6 per day.
 - Request to increase the number of races if sufficient horses are available. An increase could result in the association averaging more than 8.6 races per day.
 - During the 2004 calendar year they will satisfy the 10% requirement of stakes purses paid for Cal-bred stakes races.





- On May 12, 2003, the Board issued Statement of Issues (Nos: L-20000070187 & L-20000070190) dealing with the simulcast signals between Los Alamitos and Capitol Racing. Among other matters, the decision settled the issue of the payment of impact fees for the reciprocal simulcasts between the two racing associations. Essentially, the decision provided a formula for determining the impact fees that each association would pay each other for the simulcast signal. When the appropriate calculations were made the net result was that Capitol Racing owed Los Alamitos \$3.3 million dollars for the period April 2000 through July 2003. As evidenced by the attached letters, Capitol Racing has not complied with the Board's order as of this date.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff does not recommend approval of the application at this time.





BACKGROUND

Board Rule 1616, Minimum Weights to be Carried, provides that the minimum weight to be carried in all overnight races for two-year-olds only, three-year-olds only and four-year-olds and upward shall be 112 pounds subject to sex and apprentice allowances. The minimum weight to be carried in all races, except handicap and stakes races is 103 pounds.

The Jockeys' Guild has prepared a proposal for jockey weight allowances. Since staff does not have a copy of the proposal, this item is presented for discussion.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Board hear from the Jockeys' Guild representative.

If the agreement between the two expires and a new one cannot be completed in a timely fashion, paragraph (a)(3) of the section allows for the Board to extend the provisions of the prior agreement until such time that the new agreement is finalized.

As of this date a new agreement is not available and the Guild is requesting that the Board invoke paragraph (a)(3) and extend the terms of the prior agreement until such time as the new agreement is finalized.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board extend the prior agreement as requested.




