DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CHRB RULE 1840, VETERINARY PRACTICES AND TREATMENTS RESTRICTED, AND RULE 1890, POSSESSION OF CONTRABAND, TO PROHIBIT ENDOSCOPIES AND MEDICATIONS ADMINISTERED VIA HYPODERMIC NEEDLES OR NASOGASTRIC TUBES EXCEPT BY AUTHORIZED INDIVIDUALS (NOTE: THIS CONCLUDES THE 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD. THE BOARD MAY ADOPT THE PROPOSAL AS PRESENTED.)

Regular Board Meeting

ISSUE:

At the September 21, 2023, California Horse Racing Board (Board) meeting the Board approved the proposed amendment to Board Rules 1840, Veterinary Practices and Treatments Restricted, and 1890, Possession of Contraband.

During the 45-day public comment period for this rule change, the Board received one comment on behalf of the California Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA) to Rule 1840 (attached). The CVMA was primarily concerned with potential infringement on California Business and Professions Code Section (BPC) 4840.2 and California Code of Regulations Title 16 section 2036. BPC 4840.2 outlines the restrictions on registered veterinary technicians (RVT) and veterinary assistants regarding specific health care services. They shall not perform surgery, diagnosis and prognosis of animal diseases, and prescribing of drugs, medicine, and appliances. The comment provided suggested changes to the proposed text for Rule 1840 and clarifies what a RVT is permitted to perform.

ANALYSIS:

Staff recommends this comment be accepted. The suggested changes to the proposed text were developed in collaboration between the Board and the CVMA to address CVMA's concerns and clarify what a registered veterinary technician is permitted to perform.

BACKGROUND:

[Business and Professions Code \(BPC\) section 19440](#) states the Board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the Board shall include adopting rules and regulations for the protection of the public and the control of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering.

[BPC section 19562](#) further states that the Board may prescribe rules, regulations, and conditions, consistent with the provisions of Horse Racing Law, under which all horse races with wagering on their results shall be conducted in California.

RECOMMENDATION:

This item is presented for Board discussion and action. Included for your consideration is alternate language to address the concerns of the CVMA. Should the Board approve the amended language, the regulation will be re-noticed for an additional 15-day public comment period.

1890. Possession of Contraband

(a) No person other than a veterinarian licensed by the Board, a registered veterinary technician (RVT), or a licensed veterinarian's assistant shall have in his or her possession at a facility under the jurisdiction of the Board any drug which is a narcotic, stimulant, or depressant, or any other substance or medication that has been prepared or packaged for injection by a hypodermic syringe or hypodermic needle, or any hypodermic syringe or hypodermic needle or similar instrument which may be used for injection.

(b) No person other than a veterinarian licensed by the Board, RVT, or a licensed veterinarian's assistant shall have in his or her possession at a facility under the jurisdiction of the Board any veterinary treatment or any medicine, medication, or other substance recognized as a medication, which has not been prescribed in accordance with Rule 1840 of this division and labeled in accordance with Rule 1864 of this division.

(c) No person shall have in his or her possession on the premises during any recognized meeting any electrical stimulating or shocking device commonly known as a battery, or any mechanical stimulating device, or any other appliance, which might affect the speed or actions of a horse.

(d) The stewards may permit the possession of drugs or appliances by a licensee for personal medical needs under such conditions as the stewards may impose.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD ON THE REQUEST FROM THE CALIFORNIA AUTHORITY OF RACING FAIRS (CARF) TO DESIGNATE THE FOLLOWING 2024 RACE DATES AS A COMBINED FAIR HORSE RACING MEETING, PURSUANT TO BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE SECTION 19549.1: ALAMEDA COUNTY FAIR, JUNE 12, 2024, THROUGH JULY 9, 2024; CALIFORNIA EXPOSITION AND STATE FAIR, JULY 10, 2024, THROUGH JULY 30, 2024; HUMBOLDT COUNTY FAIR, AUGUST 21, 2024, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 17, 2024; AND THE BIG FRESNO FAIR, SEPTEMBER 18, 2024, THROUGH OCTOBER 15, 2024

The California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) has submitted a letter (see attached) to the California Horse Racing Board (Board) requesting that the Board designate the 2024 race dates of Alameda County Fair, California Exposition and State Fair, Humboldt County Fair, and The Big Fresno Fair as a combined fair horse racing meeting.

CARF also requests that the license application for each segment of the combined fair horse racing meeting be filed in the usual manner (i.e., each fair files its race meet license application individually).

NOTE: The race dates requested for Humboldt County Fair and The Big Fresno Fair each fall partially outside of the dates allocated by the Board (see below).

BACKGROUND

[Business and Professions Code \(BPC\) section 19549.1](#) states that the Board may allocate horse racing days for mixed breed and combined fair horse racing meetings pursuant to [Food and Agricultural Code section 4058](#). Subsection (a) of section 4058 stipulates that county fairs in the northern zone may form an entity for conducting combined fair horse racing meetings on days other than the days on which general fair activities are conducted.

In 2023, CARF requested that the Board designate the 2023 racing dates allocated to its member fairs as a combined fair horse racing meeting. CARF also requested that the license applications for each segment of the combined fair horse racing meeting be filed individually, as normally done for racing meetings. At its March 2023 meeting, the Board approved these requests.

ANALYSIS

The Board approved the 2024 race dates calendar for Northern California at its September 21, 2023 meeting. The CARF member fairs were approved to conduct mixed breed horse racing meetings as follows:

- Alameda County Fair at Pleasanton—6/12/24–7/9/24

- California Exposition and State Fair—7/10/24–7/30/24
- Humboldt County Fair at Ferndale—8/21/24–9/10/24
- The Big Fresno Fair—10/2/24–10/15/24

CARF's requested race dates for Humboldt County Fair and The Big Fresno Fair fall partially outside of the allocated dates approved by the Board. CARF requests a final race meet date of September 17, 2024, for Humboldt County Fair and a starting race meet date of September 18, 2024, for The Big Fresno Fair. These dates fall outside of the Board-approved allocated dates above.

The recognition of the fair race dates as a combined fair horse racing meeting will provide the mechanism needed for wagering pools to carry over from one fair to the next. In support of its request, CARF has submitted an agreement (see attached) signed by all of the above-mentioned fairs to participate in a combined fair horse racing meeting.

STAFF ANALYSIS

DISCUSSION REGARDING BOARD SUPPORT FORMULA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025.

Regular Board Meeting
April 18, 2024

ISSUE:

In order to fund the CHRB's budget for FY 2024-25, the Board must either develop a formula or approve an industry developed formula prior to July 1, 2024.

ANALYSIS:

In a special legislative session in 2009, the California State Legislature passed SBX2-16 (Ashburn) which transitioned the funding of the California Horse Racing Board's budget from the general fund through association and fair based license fees to special funding by the associations directly. Initially, the formula was based on pre-SB 16 license fee rates on brick-and-mortar wagers. More recently, with the increase in ADW wagering accelerated by the pandemic, stakeholders have included ADW handle as a factor and used market access fees to fund the Board.

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19616.51 (see below), each year the Board approves the formula by which it is funded by stakeholders. Historically, stakeholders have agreed upon the formula, but with the impending closure of Golden Gate Fields and difficult economics in horse racing, such a consensus may not be possible for the upcoming fiscal year. In fact, the Board may be faced with alternate, competing suggestions for formulas, creating the need to choose one, in order to fund its operations. California Horse Racing Law provides no guidance with respect to factors to be considered in determining a formula beyond the statutes below. Bus. & Prof. Code section 19616.51 provides the authority for the Board to determine the formula, while sections 19612.8 and 19518 only require that each association or fair, at a minimum, cover the costs directly associated with Board contractors—Stewards and Official Veterinarians-appointed for racing meet and for laboratory testing costs. Since 2009, it does not appear that those minimums were adhered to, as the associations agreed to the portion of board support for which they would be responsible. Factors that could be considered include but are not limited to, the number of racing days, direct costs of regulation, and handle.

AUTHORITY:

Bus. & Prof. Code § 19616.51. License fee reductions; Horse Racing Fund; distributions

a) Notwithstanding any other law, and in lieu of any license fee payable to the state prescribed for or referred to in Section 19491, 19491.5, 19596.3, 19601, 19601.2, 19602, 19603, 19604, 19605.25, 19605.35, 19605.45, 19605.6, 19605.7, 19605.71, 19606.5, 19606.6, 19610.8, 19611, 19612, 19614, 19616, 19616.1, 19616.2, or 19641, any association or fair that conducts a racing meeting shall only pay its proportional amount, as determined by the formula devised pursuant to paragraph (1), as a license fee to the state, to be deposited into the Horse Racing Fund, which is hereby established, to fund the board and the equine drug testing program as follows: (1) All racing associations and fairs including all breeds of racing shall participate in the funding of the board in accordance with a formula devised by the board in consultation with the industry.

(2) The baseline funding for the board and equine drug testing program in the first fiscal year after the enactment of this section shall be the amount approved in the 2008-09 Budget Act.

(3) Adjustments to the funding in subsequent budget years may only be made by an act of the Legislature.

(b) The license fee reductions resulting from subdivision (a), after payments to fund the board and the equine drug testing program, shall be distributed as follows:

(1) For thoroughbred racing only, 3 percent of the amount of the reduction shall be deposited with the official registering agency pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 19617.2 and shall thereafter be distributed in accordance with subdivisions (b), (c), and (d) of Section 19617.2. The remaining amount shall be distributed to the association that conducts the racing meeting and to horsemen participating in that racing meeting as follows:

(A) Fifty percent to the association as commissions.

(B) Fifty percent to the horsemen as purses.

(2) For quarter horse racing, 3 percent of the amount of the reduction shall be deposited with the official registering agency pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 19617.7, and shall thereafter be distributed in accordance with subdivisions (c), (d), (e), and (f) of Section 19617.7, the remaining amount shall be distributed to the association that conducts the racing meeting and to horsemen participating in that racing meeting as follows:

(A) Fifty percent to the association as commissions.

(B) Fifty percent to the horsemen as purses.

(3) For harness racing, 6 percent of the amount of the reduction shall be distributed as specified in Section 19617.6, the remaining amount shall be distributed to the association that conducts the racing meeting and to horsemen participating in that racing meeting as follows:

(A) Fifty percent to the association as commissions.

(B) Fifty percent to the horsemen as purses.

(4) For all other breeds, the remaining amount shall be distributed to the association that conducts the racing meeting and to horsemen participating in that racing meeting as follows:

(A) Fifty percent to the association as commissions.

(B) Fifty percent to the horsemen as purses.

Bus. & Prof. Code § 19612.8. Associations conducting racing meetings; payment of costs

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any association conducting a racing meeting shall pay not less than the actual amount necessary to cover the costs for compensation, including any fringe benefits, to stewards and official veterinarians and to cover the costs for that racing meeting, as provided by the board under Section 19518.

Bus. & Prof. Code § 19518. Contracting with persons licensed as stewards or veterinarians to perform duties at horse racing meets; terms; committee recommendations; benefits; rights and immunities

(a)(1) The board shall contract with persons licensed as stewards pursuant to this article to perform the duties of stewards at horse racing meets. The board shall also contract with licensed veterinarians pursuant to this article to perform the duties of official veterinarians at horse racing meets. Contracts shall be upon any terms that the board, the stewards, and the official veterinarians may mutually agree upon and may contain different rates of compensation based upon the experience of the steward or official veterinarian.

(2) The board shall establish a committee of at least two board members to meet at least quarterly with representatives of the stewards, so that recommendations of the stewards can be discussed as necessary. These meetings may be scheduled for the same day as regular board meetings or at the convenience of the board. Representatives of associations may attend and participate in these meetings, or portions thereof, when items directly affecting the associations are discussed.

(3) The board shall provide remuneration, including any fringe benefits, to stewards, to the official veterinarian, and for the costs of laboratory testing relating to horse racing.

(b) Stewards, official veterinarians, and other racing officials appointed or approved by the board, and while performing duties required by this chapter or by the board, shall be entitled to the same rights and immunities granted public employees by Article 3 (commencing with Section 820) of Chapter 1 of Part 2 of Division 3.6 of Title 1 of the Government Code.

(c) The Legislature finds and declares that the services performed by stewards and official veterinarians at horse racing meetings are unique and cannot be performed adequately, competently, or satisfactorily by civil service personnel, and that the services cannot be adequately rendered by an existing public agency and do not duplicate the function of an existing public agency. Stewards and official veterinarians shall be personal service contractors of the board and shall not be civil service employees.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD TO APPROVE THE REQUEST BY 1/ST RACING TO AMEND THE CURRENT CORPORATE STRUCTURE DESIGNATED ON THE SANTA ANITA AND GOLDEN GATE FIELDS RACING LICENSES.

ISSUE:

On or about December 22, 2023, 1/ST Racing provided notice to the California Horse Racing Board (Board) regarding a reorganization at the corporate level of 1/ST Racing. It is represented that these changes will not affect the management, operation, financial health, or customer service of its California racing entities, which includes Santa Anita Park and Golden Gate Fields.

ANALYSIS:

CHRB Rule 1432 (see below) generally gives the Board broad authority to require information, including shareholder information. CHRB staff is bringing the matter to the Board as an update, but there is no action for the Board to take at this time.

BACKGROUND:

Authority:

Bus. & Prof. Code § 19420: Jurisdiction and supervision over meetings in this State where horse races with wagering on their results are held or conducted, and over all persons or things having to do with the operation of such meetings, is vested in the California Horse Racing Board.

Bus. & Prof. Code § 19440 (in part): (a) The board shall have all powers necessary and proper to enable it to carry out fully and effectually the purposes of this chapter. Responsibilities of the board shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

(5) Licensing of each racing association and all persons, other than the public at large, who participate in a horse racing meeting with parimutuel wagering.

CHRB Rule 1432 (Board May Demand Information): The Board may require any racing association, prospective racing association or other person intending to make application for license to conduct a horseracing meeting to furnish the Board with a detailed proposal and disclosure as to its proposed racing program, purse program, officials, principals or shareholders, plant, premises, facility, finances, lease arrangements, agreements, contracts and such other information as the Board may require to determine the eligibility and qualifications of the association or person to conduct a race meeting.

CHRB Rule 1439 (List of Shareholders): Each association shall, if a corporation, maintain a current list of stockholders and the number of shares held by each and such list shall be

available for inspection by the Board. The association shall immediately inform the Board of any change of corporate officers or directors, or any change in stockholders when such change of the holdings of any individual stockholder exceeds 5% of the outstanding shares of the corporation. The real owner of the stock shall be listed if known. The Board may require the disclosure of the real name of any individual or person who holds over 5% of the outstanding shares of any racing association and may refuse to issue a license to, or suspend the license of, any association which fails to disclose the real name of such shareholders if such information is known to or ascertainable by the association.

ISSUE

On November 16, 2023, the California Horse Racing Board granted a license to conduct a thoroughbred race meet to the Los Angeles Turf Club (LATC). The license period encompasses December 20, 2023, through June 18, 2024. LATC is requesting an amendment to their existing license to permit a new wager called the “Three by Three”.

ANALYSIS

LATC requests to amend its wagering menu to add the Pick (n) Position (x) as defined by ARCI-004-105(T). The wager will be a Pick (3) Position (3), which will be known as the “Three by Three.” The wager will utilize payout Method 6 (ARCI-004-105(T)(4)(f)). In this wager, the customer needs to select the top three finishers, in exact order, in three designated races. Each race day, LATC will designate three consecutive races which will be used for the Three by Three. LATC will use scratch rule Method 1 (ARCI-004-105(T)(7)(c)(A)). It will be a \$1 wager and have a takeout rate of 22.00%.

Pursuant to ARCI-004-105(T)(2), “the association must obtain written approval from the Commission concerning the scheduling of Pick (n) Position (x) contests, the designation of one of the methods prescribed in Parts 3 and 6, the percentages of the net pool apportioned between the major share of the Position (x) pool and the minor share(s) of the Position (x) pool, and the amount of any cap to be set on the carryover. Any changes to the approved Pick (n) Position (x) format require prior approval from the Commission.”

Here LATC requests the following changes to the Pick (n) Position (x):

1. The winner of any share of the pool also qualifies for all additional tiers that require fewer winning selections.
2. If there are no winning tickets for a minor share, that minor share will carryover to the corresponding minor share for the next Three by Three. On a mandatory payout day, any minor share that is not won will be added to the major share, and if there are no winning tickets for the major share that day, then it, along with any major share carryover, will be added to the minor share that has the greatest number of correct selections. On a mandatory payout day, if there are no winning tickets for the major share, only the amount of money wagered that day, and any applicable carryover, will be paid out—the \$10,000 guarantee of the major pool will not roll down to the minor pool that has the most correct winning selections.

- Minor Share #5 – range of 3-4 horses selected in exact position – 0.01622%
- Principal Minor Share – 0%

Pursuant to ARCI-004-105(T)(2), LATC requests that the California Horse Racing Board (“CHRB”) approve the following modifications to ARCI-004-105(T).

1. The winner of any share of the pool also qualifies for all additional tiers that require fewer winning selections. The following two examples illustrate the rule. Example 1: A customer correctly selects all nine (9) horses in exact position. The customer will be deemed to be holding a winning ticket for the Major Share as well as a winning ticket for each of the Minor Shares #1-5. Example 2: A customer selects six (6) horses in exact position. The customer will be deemed to be holding a winning ticket for each of the Minor Shares #3-5.

2. If there are no winning tickets for a minor share, that minor share will carryover to the corresponding minor share for the next Three by Three. We believe that ARCI-004-105(T) already allows for each minor share to carryover to the minor shares for the next Three by Three. However, if the CHRB disagrees, we request that each minor share be allowed to carryover to the corresponding minor share for the next Three by Three. On a mandatory payout day, any minor share that is not won will be added to the major share, and if there are no winning tickets for the major share that day, then it, along with any major share carryover, will be added to the minor share that has the greatest number of correct selections. On a mandatory payout day, if there are no winning tickets for the major share, only the amount of money wagered that day, and any applicable carryover, will be paid out—the \$10,000 guarantee of the major pool will not roll down to the minor pool that has the most correct winning selections.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD REGARDING AN AMENDMENT TO THE
APPLICATION FOR THE ADVANCE DEPOSIT WAGERING (ADW) PROVIDER
XPRESSBET, LLC PURSUANT TO BOARD RULE 2072(I)

Board Meeting
April 18, 2024

ISSUE:

Xpressbet, LLC (Xpressbet), an out-of-state multijurisdictional wagering hub with a Board approval to conduct advance deposit wagering (ADW), has submitted a request to grant Hillside (Fantasy) LLC, dba Bet365, access to its ADW platform, whereby customers using Bet365 website (www.bet365racing.com) and mobile applications may access, via a portal, Xpressbet's ADW services in California. Subsection (I) of Board Rule 2072 requires that any amendments to the operating procedures contained in an application for approval to conduct ADW, subsequent to Board approval of the application, be permitted by order of the Board or by Board approval of a request submitted in writing by the applicant.

BACKGROUND:

At its December 15, 2022 meeting, the Board granted Xpressbet an approval as an out-of-state ADW provider, with a term of January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2024. Currently, under its approval, Xpressbet may accept wagers from California residents on out-of-state Quarter Horse races. Xpressbet may also accept wagers from California residents on races conducted by a California association or fair if the Board approves a race meet application submitted by the association or fair that includes an ADW agreement with Xpressbet, along with approval from the appropriate horsemen's organization.

The Board has approved various requests in the past by ADW providers to amend their plans of operations to include the use of a wagering portal. More recently, at its October 2023 meeting, the Board approved a request by Churchill Downs Technology Initiatives Company (CDTIC) dba Twinspires and dba BetAmerica to grant DK Crown Holding, Inc., Crown Gaming Inc., and DK Horse, LLC (collectively, "DraftKings") access to its ADW platform, whereby customers using DraftKings' website (www.dkhorse.com) and mobile applications to access CDTIC's ADW services in California via a portal.

ANALYSIS:

The approval of Xpressbet's request would allow customers of Bet365's platform to access Xpressbet's ADW services in California via a portal. Xpressbet would provide the same technology and application programming interfaces and in the same manner as offered by Xpressbet on www.xpressbet.com, and Xpressbet's responsibilities would include, but not be limited to, account setup, maintenance, customer service, and wager

processing. The Bet365 platform would act as another brand through which Xpressbet would carry out its ADW services.
