Apprentice Jockey David C. Lopez and the Stewards reviewed the video of the first race from Sunday, May 3, 2015. The young rider was aware his horse shied from his whip and was quick to straighten his mount. He was also aware that his mount made a satisfactory correction.

05-07-15⁴**JUAN HUMBERTO MOYA (14GG0082)**

A formal hearing was held for owner Juan Humberto Moya, who has been charged with violating a number of California Horse Racing Board rules in connection with

an alleged intentional mis-identification of a quarter horse prior to a required workout. The incident took place at the Alameda County Fairgrounds on August 3, 2014.

Present, in addition to the Board of Stewards (Herbiveaux, McHargue, Nevin) were Deputy Attorney General Mary Cain-Simon, who presented the case, California Horse Racing Board Staff Counsel Phil Laird, California Horse Racing Board Investigator Louis Quesada, Mr. Moya and his attorney Wiley Driskill. Certified interpreter Cathy Marsili was also present to assist Mr. Moya and Certified Court Reporter Christina Niccoli recorded the proceedings.

The hearing was opened with Ms. Cain-Simon presenting the charges and Mr. Moya was questioned at length. Alameda County Fair Clocker Kathy Seeley, the first of a number of witnesses, testified.

Due to time constraints this portion of the hearing was adjourned and the respective counsels were requested to decide on a mutually agreeable date for the conclusion of this hearing.

RULING #75 – WILLIAM ANTONGEORGI

RULING#75

Jockey **WILLIAM ANTONGEORGI III** who rode **REMEMBER BENGHAZI** in the first race at Golden Gate Fields on Sunday, May 3, 2015, is suspended three (3) racing days (May 14, 15 and 16, 2015) for failure to make a proper effort to maintain a straight course in the stretch and causing interference resulting in the disqualification of his mount from second to third; a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (d) & (f) (Riding Rules – Careless Riding).

The foregoing ruling was issued after Mr. Antongeorgi and the Stewards reviewed the first race from Sunday, May 3, 2015.

The veteran rider was very forthright in acknowledging he erred by failing to insure he was clear prior to allowing his mount to drift and cause interference.

05-08-15⁴ **INQUIRY – NO CHANGE – 2ND RACE**

The Stewards posted the inquiry sign following the second race for a review of the stretch run.

After a thorough review the Stewards decided unanimously to make the original order of finish official.

The video shows #3 JAKOE'S MAGIC (David L. Garcia) first and #4 PORT STANLEY (Frank Alvarado) second engaged in mutual contact through the stretch that the Stewards determined were offsetting offenses.

05-09-15³ **PROVISIONAL EXERCISE RIDER**

Provisional exercise rider Karen Garcia met with the Stewards regarding concerns about her progress or lack thereof. The morning outriders have mentioned their concern about Ms. Garcia to Safety Steward Richard Lewis and when she was recently unseated on the track, he brought the matter to our attention.

After much discussion and no argument from Ms. Garcia, who has had her provisional license since February 2, 2015, the Stewards suggested she surrender that license, rather than the alternative. The alternative is we would terminate that license. The Stewards informed Ms. Garcia that if she went to a ranch and gained some experience she could return and we would activate her provisional license. Ms. Garcia indicated her intent was to do just that, gain employment at a private facility.

05-09-15⁴ **TRAINER WILLIAM J. NOLAN (15GG0029)**

Trainer William J. Nolan appeared in response to a complaint filed against him by the California Horse Racing Board for violating the terms of a suspension he served from January 5, 2015 through March 5, 2015.

Mr. Nolan was not represented by counsel, California Horse Racing Board Investigator Louis Quesada presented the case and CSR Christine Niccoli recorded the proceedings.

Documentation and testimony was presented that alleged Mr. Nolan was seen on and around the Alameda County Fairgrounds and near that satellite facility, while under suspension.

STEWARDS REVIEW – 4TH RACE

The Stewards conducted a video review of the fifth race for the wagering public of an incident on the turn involving #4 BLOW THE WHISTLE (Alejandro Gomez), who finished fourth in the six horse field.

The video shows BLOW THE WHISTLE caused his own problem by failing to negotiate the turn, running into tight quarters and steadying near the 5/16 pole.

The Stewards showed the public several video angles of the first turn of this (5th race) one mile stake race.

The videos show #2 KRSTO SKYE (Abel Cedillo) bolted and caused his own problem. KRSTO SKYE will be placed on the Stewards List.
