05-15-14²**MCCANNA RULING #69 (CASE #14GG0037)**

Trainer **TIMOTHY F. MCCANNA**, who started the horse **MEGAN'S BUDDY**, fifth place finisher in the seventh race at Golden Gate Fields on March 20, 2014, is fined the sum of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00)* pursuant to California Racing Board rule #1887 (Trainer to Insure Condition of Horse) for violation of CHRB rule 1843 (a) & (d) (Medication, Drugs and Other Substances: (Phenylbutazone – in excess of permitted level – 2.9 ng/ml and Methocarbamol 13,057 ng/ml – [Class 4])).

The above ruling was published after McCanna appeared last Sunday and pled guilty. He had no explanation as to why the bute level exceeded the limit, why the presence of Methocarbomal was detected or why that level was exceedingly high. After due deliberations the Stewards felt the penalty imposed was appropriate.

05-15-14³**FLORES RULING****RULING NO.70**

Jockey **PABLO FLORES** who rode ITHOUGHTIPAYDYOU in the fourth race at Golden Gate Fields on Sunday, May 11, 2014 is suspended three (3) racing days (May 22, 23 and 24, 2014) for failure to make a proper effort to maintain a straight course soon after the start and causing interference resulting in a disqualification of his mount from 4th to 5th; a violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule #1699 (a) (d) & (f) (Riding Rules-Careless Riding).

The above ruling was issued after Flores appeared and, after initially stating he made a concerted effort to control his mount, admitted, after viewing the tapes of the race with the Stewards that said effort was not only weak but ineffective.

The above ruling was issued after the Stewards received verbal notice from Dr. Grantham that Ribeiro had finally remitted the \$542.50 which satisfied the outstanding obligation.

05-17-14²**STEWARDS INQUIRY – EIGHTH RACE – NO CHANGE**

The Stewards lit the inquiry lamp to review the start of this one mile turf event after #6 BEAST OF BOURBON failed to break with the field and when he did leave the gate the horse was riderless. After a thorough review the Stewards affirmed the original order of finish. Tapes showed that BEAST OF BOURBON reared simultaneously to the starting gate stall doors opening and unseated jockey Juan Hernandez in the process. Since the stall doors opened properly BEAST OF BOURBON was declared a starter and no refunds were warranted.

Sunday05-18-14¹**FREY DECISION (REFER 05-10-14³)****RULING NO.72**

Jockey **KYLE FREY** is hereby suspended ninety (90) days retroactive From May 2, 2014 through July 30, 2014 and placed on probation for the term of his license (January 31, 2015) pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1900 (Grounds for Suspension or Revocation) for violation of California Horse Racing Board rules #1489 (h) (Grounds for Denial or Refusal of License) and #1874.4 (Disorderly Conduct) after submitting a urine sample on April 5, 2014 which showed the presence of mind altering substances (Synthetic Cannabinoids: Spice). Prior to the reinstatement of his license privileges Mr. Frey must complete an in house rehabilitation program sponsored by the Winners Foundation or other similar organization acceptable to the Board of Stewards and sign a minimum one year con-

tract with the Winners Foundation going forward from the date his license privileges are restored.

Condition of probation includes the signing of a test agreement with the California Horse Racing Board which will be valid during the term of this or any subsequent license held by Mr. Frey.

During the term of this suspension all licenses and license privileges of KYLE FREY are suspended pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards); subject is denied access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

The above ruling was issued following a formal hearing. Frey appeared today, along with track physician Dr. David Seftel, to discuss the details of the ruling and the Stewards' expectations with respect to some of the conditions contained therein.

At the hearing on May 10, 2014 Seftel testified that Frey was currently enrolled in an eight week out-patient substance abuse program at Kaiser Permanente. Seftel stated at the hearing that this program coupled with a three week in-house program with Kaiser at the conclusion of the out-patient treatment was, in his opinion, preferable to the option presented by the Winners Foundation. The Stewards, after deliberating over the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, allowed Frey the option to choose between the two programs.

At today's conference it was explained to Frey that if he chose the Kaiser program he must complete both portions, the out-patient and the in-house before he would be eligible for re-instatement of his license privileges. Frey would also need to abide by the terms of a testing agreement and be under the supervision of the Winners Foundation for one year after he is re-instated and that organization would monitor his compliance going forward.
