It was taken into consideration that Mr. Talamo was riding a two year old first time starter, but he was informed that, in the Stewards' opinion, he was pressing his riding options and choices during the race. He was advised it was in his best interest to be more patient when making riding decisions. He agreed and left the office with a warning.

Case #10SA139 involving a financial against Jesus Mendoza filed by groom Porfirio Orosco for late wages was dismissed after Mr. Mendoza satisfied the complaint.

INQUIRY FIRST RACE (4 1/2 Furlongs-Cushion Track)/NO CHANGE

Following the running of the race the inquiry sign was posted to review an incident coming off the turn into the stretch. Involved were #1 Gab Power (1st-F. Valdez) and #4 Ride Candy Ride (3rd-M. Pedroza). After a review of the films, conferring with the Patrol Judges and both jockeys involved, it was a unanimous decision to let the original order of finish stand. The films verified that #1, behind a wall of horses chose to push his way out rather than to stop his forward momentum. This action forced #4 out, but in the opinion of the Stewards #4 was not denied the 8 1/2 lengths he was beaten for 2nd place.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT HEARING CASE #10SA073

In a formal setting before the Board of Stewards, a settlement agreement between trainer Mark Glatt and the California Horse Racing Board was introduced by investigator Frank Fink. This settlement agreement was placed into evidence as exhibit #1 without objection, approved by the Board of Stewards and the following ruling was issued:

HRT# #013

Trainer MARK GLATT, having reached a settlement agreement with the California Horse Racing Board, is fined THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00)* and suspended for thirty (30) days (June 1, 2010, through June 30, 2010) with such suspension to be stayed provided respondent be placed on probation for a period of one (1) year from the date of this ruling and during that period, he must not be in violation of California Horse Racing Board Rules and Regulations, sections #1843, #1843.6 or #1887 regarding Class 1, Class 2, or Class 3 drug substances.

In the event of a probation violation, during the term of suspension, all licenses and license privileges of Mark Glatt would be suspended and pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1528 (Jurisdiction of Stewards to Suspend or Fine), Mr. Glatt would be denied all access to all premises in this jurisdiction.

VIDEO REVIEW

Jockey Felipe Valdez met with the Stewards as directed to review the first race from yesterday (ref. 05/12/10³). Mr. Valdez stated that his mount, a first-time starting two year old, had a light mouth and was hard to control. The available video verified some of his statement. He was excused with a warning, and was told that more effort was expected in the future. Mr. Valdez said he would comply.

Jockey Silvio Amador met with the Stewards to review the second race from yesterday in which two incidents were of concern. The first near the 1/8 pole, it appeared Mr. Amador flicked his horse three times on its ear with his whip. He admitted doing this to keep his mount straight and focused, and was not aware this style of riding is not permitted. He promised it would not happen in the future. A majority vote (Steward Chaney dissent) felt that a warning was the appropriate penalty for his action.

The second incident involved the fourth place finisher #1 Too Pink (C. S. Reyes) in the stretch drive, racing inside of #3 Daniella Roth (5th-S. Amador). After a review of the 7/8 and 1/4 pole cameras, it appeared that Mr. Reyes reached over and pulled on the left rein of Mr. Amador's mount. Mr. Amador confirmed this incident and said at the time Mr. Reyes told Mr. Amador to "ride his mount". It is possible that this could have cost #3 a better position, but no camera angle indicated it conclusively whether that the incident took place before, at or after the wire.

REYES RULING

LATS #014

Pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1900 (Grounds for Suspension or Revocation), Apprentice Jockey **CHRISTIAN SANTIAGO REYES** is suspended for **TEN (10) RACING DAYS (May 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30, 2010)** for violation of California Horse Racing Board Rule #1489 (g) (Grounds For Denial or Refusal of License- intemperate act which exposes others to danger), while riding "Too Pink" in connection with the second race at Hollywood Park on May 12, 2010.

Term of suspension shall not prohibit participation in designated races pursuant to California Horse Racing Board rule #1766 (Designated Races).

This ruling was issued after a film review and discussion pertaining to Mr. Reyes' ride in the second race. Jockey valet Raul Ramirez interpreted for him and verified that he pulled the rein of the #3 horse. It was translated that Mr. Reyes stated "he was just kidding around and meant no harm, it was all in fun". He was told this kind of behavior was unacceptable in this industry. At the end of the hearing Mr. Reyes fully understood the seriousness of his action and apologized before he left the office.

HEADLEY HEARING CASE #10SA123

Trainer Gustav Headley was given, an informal hearing involving CHRB rule 1844(a) (Authorized Medication). Mr. Headley had submitted a trainer medication report three days after his trainee raced, thus making the sample sent to the laboratory identified as racing without medication which was incorrect. Mr. Headley after much discussion admitted this delay in his responsibility to report the medication was due to his forgetfulness. Decision to follow.

SADDLE TRADE

During the pre race warm up it was discovered by jockey Julio Garcia aboard # 4 Shine'n Time(weight 116) he was sitting in apprentice jockey Christian Reyes' saddle, who in turn was aboard # 3 Such Fortune (weight *113) was astride jockey Garcia's saddle. Once this information was given to the Stewards the two horses were sent back to be re-saddled. Both jockeys weighed out again to ascertain their proper weight. This procedure caused a ten minute delay.

There is a meeting scheduled tomorrow in the jockey quarters with the clerk of scales and all jockey valets to address procedures that could prevent this in the future.
